

1. Where is the place of encounter with Immigration: the *Interior* or a *Point of Entry*? \_\_\_\_\_

**Interior** is anywhere inside the United States that is not a point-of-entry.

**Point-of-entry** is at an airport, seaport or land border crossing where the person is seeking permission from an immigration officer to enter the United States.

2. What is the immigration status, from the following list? \_\_\_\_\_

**Asylee** – A person who was granted asylum by an Immigration Officer or a United States Immigration Judge while already in the United States.

**Crewman** – A person who served on board a ship who entered the United States with a “D” non-immigrant visa.

**Immigrant** – A person who is a lawful permanent resident of the United States (has a green card). This includes individuals who adjusted status within the United States or entered the United States with an immigrant visa.

**Non-immigrant** – A person who entered the United States with a temporary visa. This includes the person whose non-immigrant visa has already expired.

**No Lawful Status** – A person who entered the United States

without inspection by an Immigration Officer or who never presented himself or herself to an Immigration Official for admission or parole into the United States.

**Parolee** – A person with no visa to enter the United States but has been allowed to enter for a temporary period or specific purpose. Specific purposes include but are not limited to humanitarian reasons, criminal prosecution, medical procedures, and deferred inspection.

**Prior Order** – A person who was previously removed, deported or excluded from the United States who re-enters the United States without permission from the government of the United States.

**Refugee** – A person (having a fear of return to his or her country of nationality based on past or

future persecution because of race, religion, nationality, membership in a particular social group or political opinion) granted the status of refugee while outside the United States – typically by the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees.

**Stowaway** – A person who entered or attempted to enter the United States after sneaking aboard a vessel without permission or payment for fare.

**Visa Waiver Applicant** – A person who does not need a visa to enter the United States as a non-immigrant because of a reciprocal treaty or arrangement between the government of the United States and the person’s own country.
